# **IT'S NOMINATION TIME!**

Every year in September, as required by our by-laws, the **Channel Islands Divers** hold **elections** for the board of directors (BOD). Every position is available, some are open seats, some are not. In addition to written nominations, nominations from the floor are allowed at the June, July, and August meetings for names going on the ballets at the September meeting. Descriptions for each board position are in the next paragraph, and a self-nomination form can be found on the following page and on our Facebook page under the "files" tab. Write-ins at the September meeting are allowed for that last minute decision.

# TERM LIMITS & CURRENT BOD STATUS

Per the By-Laws of the Channel Islands Dive Club, Inc., Article VII: Election of Board of Directors, Section I:

"No board member may hold a specific board position for more than four (4) consecutive election years. In the event a term limit is reached, and at the time of the election no nominations for that position exist, the existing board member may run for said position for another election year."

To assist club members in deciding to run for the board of directors, or choose a nominee, here is the current status of each of the current board positions.

**<u>PRESIDENT</u>**: Michael Cunningham, elected September 2022. Mike has indicated a willingness to run for a second election year as President.

**<u>VICE PRESIDENT/SPEAKER SEEKER:</u> OPEN.** Steve Peterson, termed-out as of August 2022, but due to the absence of a nominee for the position, Steve agreed to fill the position for the 2022-23 year.

**TREASURER:** Ann Hoagland, appointed to the position in February 2023 after the death of our beloved Karen Duran. Ann has indicated a willingness to run for the position, which, if elected would be her first election year as Treasurer.

**<u>SECRETARY</u>**: Rob Marion, elected September 2021. Rob has indicated a willingness to run for his third election year as Secretary.

**<u>MEMBERSHIP COORDINATOR</u>**: Laura Forsyth, elected September 2022. Laura has indicated a willingness to run for her second election year as Membership Coordinator.

<u>DIVE COORDINATOR</u>: Sandy Bickford, appointed to the vacant position in August 2022, and elected as Dive Coordinator in September 2022. Sandy has indicated a willingness to run for her second election year as Dive Coordinator.

**<u>RAFFLE COORDINATOR</u>**: Teresa Ray, elected September 2021. Teresa has indicated a willingness to run for her third election year as Raffle Coordinator.

**WEBMASTER:** Delbert Stewart, elected September 2022. Del has indicated a willingness to run for his second election year as Webmaster.

**<u>NEWSLETTER EDITOR</u>**: **OPEN.** No one ran for Newsletter Editor in September 2022, so our Dive Coordinator, Sandy Bickford, has been temporarily preparing the newsletter. However, Sandy has stated she will not continue to publish the newsletter beginning with the 2023-24 term.

**<u>LIBRARIAN</u>**: Mike Frabasilio has been filling this unofficial, non-voting position, and at the July 19 meeting, the Board voted to amend the by-laws and make the Librarian an official, voting position on the board of directors. Mike has indicated a willingness to run for his first term in the newly created board position.

**PRESIDENT:** Develops agendas and conducts the general and board meetings.

VICE PRESIDENT/SPEAKER SEEKER: Finds speakers for the general meetings. Sets up the video/computer connections, as necessary.

TREASURER: Records and tracks all incoming and outgoing monies.

**SECRETARY:** Takes minutes of board meetings including any motions passed or proposed.

**DIVE COORDINATOR:** Plans with board and general member input, dive charters, trips, and other activities.

**RAFFLE COORDINATOR:** Purchase raffle prizes. Describe raffle prizes, assist with the selling raffle tickets, record prize winners.

**MEMBERSHIP COORDINATOR:** Maintains current membership list; sends monthly updates to president and the board for email contact lists.

**WEBMASTER:** Responsible for maintaining the CID website.

**NEWSLETTER EDITOR:** Collect, layout, and edits articles from board, general membership, and other sources.

LIBRARIAN: Collects books, videos, and other ocean or diving materials. Displays the library at all club meetings, and tracks all materials borrowed by club members.

# A World of Blue: Inspiration for a Sustainable Future for Our Oceans

Holly S. Lohuis, marine biologist, marine educator, science advisor and Jean-Michel Cousteau's dive partner for the past 25 years, will share a wealth of stories and beautiful images from her adventurous life, including behind the scenes images from Jean-Michel Cousteau Ocean Futures Society's IMAX film, 'Secret Ocean 3D'.


Holly speaks to the beauty and crises facing our water planet, highlighting the complexities of the ocean environment and some of the impacts threatening the long-term vitality of our oceans. Her inspirational talk will remind us that small actions can lead to big changes, and that we need to be the motivating force to strive for more ocean education, both locally and around the world.

With a degree in aquatic biology from UC Santa Barbara and experience in the ocean realm around the world, Holly works for a variety of organizations, including: Jean-Michel Cousteau's Ocean Futures Society, Santa Barbara Maritime Museum's *Ocean Connections* and *Marine Science*, and Island Packers as a Naturalist at the Channel Islands National Park. Throughout the work she does, Holly shares important ecological facts on why ocean health is critical for the sustainability of our water planet.

With support from the Ocean Futures Society, Santa Barbara Maritime Museum, Condor Express and Island Packers, Holly is also **helping to spearhead the effort to create a whale heritage area in the Santa Barbara** 

**Channel**, under the UK's World Cetacean Alliance. She is working with a group of local whale enthusiasts, including whale watching tour operators, naturalists, biologists, fishers, educators, resource managers, artists, and local marine conservation NGOs. Her hope for the future is that the Santa Barbara Channel will be part of the growing network of Whale Heritage Sites where whales are celebrated for their ecological role in enhancing ocean productivity; where whales have an economic value through responsible tourism; where conservation and research is a priority in reducing the impacts on their longevity; and where we can continue to learn and appreciate the rich complex lives of whales and dolphins.

## CID DIVE TRIP LIABILITY RELEASES ARE DUE NO LATER THAN OUR CLUB MEETING OF August 16!

\*\*13 club members have signed-up for our Leo Carrillo Beach Dive & Lunch!\*\* (You can still sign up at our August 16 meeting)

We are still scheduled for Leo Carrillo, but remember plans may change at the last minute due to dive conditions! Also, as of two weeks ago, the North-end Parking Lot was still closed due to damage from Winter storms. We will now have to park on PCH and walk down to the dive site. If we change locations, all club members on the signup sheet will be notified about the change by email from our Dive Coordinator.

If you have ever wanted to try a shore dive in our area, but didn't know the first thing about how to go about it, now is your chance to be assisted by two very experienced club members. There are several dive sites to explore, and if you have ever driven down PCH, you have probably noticed the kelp forest at Leo Carrillo; it is absolutely huge! Substantial reefs, walls, pinnacles, and channel extend beyond the kelp, and they provide a perfect home for numerous nudibranch, golden gorgonian coral, sea stars, sheephead, garibaldi, and octopus.

The park is located at **35000 West Pacific Coast Highway**, **Malibu**, **CA 90265 (about 30 miles South from Ventura**.) Here are some other things to know about Leo Carrillo State Park and our dive trip:

- Park in the **North-end Parking Lot**, which is also our dive entry point. The day-use parking lots open at 8am and closes at 10pm.
- Parking fees are: All day = \$12 per car; 3 hrs = \$9 per car; 2 hrs = \$6 per car; 1 hr = \$3 per car
- Showers: The park has token-operated showers, and the token machines accept ONLY one dollar bills.
- Leo Carrillo Beach Store: Located across PCH at the center of the campground.
- We will do either a one-tank or two-tank dive, depending on the wishes of the participants.
- The water temperature averages in the mid-60s in August.
- We are planning to meet somewhere for lunch after diving, and everyone is welcomed to join us!

# Originally, we had also planned to have a demonstration of how to set up a kayak for diving, but those plans have fallen through. Don't despair, we will do a club kayak demonstration and dive at a future date.

Even if you don't plan to dive, come on out a enjoy a Southern California morning and lunch with us!

# SANTA ROSA ISLAND HIKE

Santa Rosa Island is very special in our Northern Channel Islands chain. It is the location where possibly the oldest human remains in the Americas were found in 1959, and remains of pygmy mammoths, which appear to have gone extinct about 13,000 years ago, have been excavated. In addition, the island is home to the rare Torry Pine, a species of pine tree that exists only in two locations around the world, (Yes, we usually hike to the Torry Pines.) Throughout much of the late 20h century ,Santa Rosa Island was privately owned and was used for sheep and cattle ranching, as well as for private hunting of non-native deer and elk. By 2011, all private activities on the island ceased, and Santa Rosa Island opened to the public. Today, we are able to enjoy the buildings and other structures left by the longtime ranching operations, as well as marvel at the wind-swept landscape.

Our day trip to Santa Rosa will probably include a choice of two hikes: An easy 3 mile roundtrip hike from the pier to the Water Canyon campground, or the more moderate 7.5 mile roundtrip hike to the Torry Pines. Since there is fresh water on Santa Rosa, it is likely you will see an island fox along the way!

On the way home, after marveling at the unique Santa Rosa Island, we are treated to another marvel of nature. Did you know that our own Santa Cruz Island is home to the largest sea cave in California and the 4th largest in the world by length? Island Packers will end our day at Painted Cave on the northwest side of Santa Cruz. If you have never been there, you don't want to miss Painted Cave!
