With all that experience, we will hear the incredible stories from Ben's 56 years of diving including being stranded on the Cortez Bank Bell Buoy for 3 hours! Come see Ben's artifacts that he has found diving. Also, Ben will also be exhibiting some of the diving equipment he has developed over the years.

 MEMBERS' ONLY COST: Combined Course = \$250 (regular price is \$400) Stand-alone Oxygen Course = \$150 (regular price is \$200)



When registration opened for our DAN First Aid and Oxygen Courses back in September, many club members asked if the classes would be offered again. Yes! Another class is open, and it is time to reserve your spot. Once again, you have the option of taking the DAN Combined First Aid & Oxygen Course on January 19 & 20, or the DAN Stand-alone Oxygen Course on January 20.

The Combined First Aid & Oxygen course meets the renewal requirements for Rescue Divers, Master Divers, and Instructors. The DAN Oxygen Course alone is strongly

recommended for club members who attend our monthly beach dives.

We are taking advantage of the holiday in January by offering the course on Sunday & Monday so you won't have to take off work to attend class. We don't know when the classes might be offered again, and the class sizes are kept small, so don't delay in reserving your spot. Jade Beneath the Sea tells the fascinating story of a group of divers who found


