APRIL 19, 2023 MEETING

John Barrus, Lee Mackay, and Tom Hodge

Freediving and Spearfishing The Channel Islands

Lee and John have been friends since elementary school. Almost 20 years ago, a mutual friend suggested we all go camp on Catalina Island. He brought a small speargun with him, and we all spent the weekend snorkeling and trying our best to catch fish. We were hooked. Over the years spearfishing has become a passion, progressively moving from beach diving in Malibu, to kayak diving, to buying boats and running out to the Channel Islands, including San Clemente and Santa Barbara island, in pursuit of large pelagic game fish and giant lobster. While heavily involved in the Boy Scouts of America, Tom was looking for help taking some scouts on a scuba adventure to Santa Cruz. He caught wind of what Lee and John were doing and asked for some help with the trip. After getting a little exposure to spearfishing and free diving on that trip, Tom was hooked instantly. He went through the progression of scuba diving, gathering lobsters, shooting reef fish, and then making the jump into free diving and hunting pelagic fish. Together we have expanded our range, taking many trips down to Mexico, and later this year we are scheduled on another adventure to spearfish for large halibut in Alaska. We are excited to share our knowledge of the sport and talk about our many adventures.



Dive Sites: Anacapa Island on the *Spectre*

(Cat Rock/Pyramid Point; The Lighthouse; Winfield Scott Wreck)

Average Depth: 40 to 60 feet

Visibility: 20 to 40 feet

Temperature: 53 degrees (Brrrrrrr!!!)

We started off at Santa Cruz Island, but the conditions were bad, so we took a short boat ride over to Anacapa. Our first dive spot at Cat Rock/Pyramid Point was a rather easy dive, with lots of dry suits due to the cold water. There was some current, but the highlight was hunters had good luck finding scallops at this site.

The sun isn't up yet, and we haven't left the dock, but Tony is already attending to the first task of the day - Prepare the camera!

Our next dive site was The Lighthouse, where we were met with a huge raft
of female sea lions. It was hard to tell who was having more fun, the divers and snorkelers
who were watching the sea lions, or the sea lions who were having a great time darting around the people in the water.

Out of the three dives, the *Winfield Scott* wreck was the best! Monster lobsters, four large horn sharks, one horn shark egg, and schools of fish. Of course, the *Spectre* ship crew were very helpful on all the dives, and the food was excellent.. We had an added bonus on our way back when we were able to see the Pt. Mugu Air Show from the ocean, which was delightful,



NEW CLUB EVENT: DIVE TRIP ON THE PEACE DIVE BOAT July 2, 2023 6:00 AM Cost per diver: \$169 (members only) Spots available: 7

Now that you've looked at the fun we had on our March 19 *Spectre* trip and are wishing you had been there, it is time to start thinking about the club's next dive trip!

Several club members have asked me about the possibility of diving off the *Peace*, and now we are going to do it! But before I get into the details of the trip, here is a little information about the *Peace*:

The *Peace* is a 62 foot, wooden hulled boat that was built in 1972 specifically for diving. It can accommodate a maximum of 30 divers, and has game tanks and freshwater tanks for cameras, as well as four compressors that can fill tanks to 3,500 PSI. There is a comfortable galley and bunk room (bedding *is not* provided), and let's not forget a hot tub for a nice soak after a day of diving!

Here are the details of our trip:

- When Sunday, July 2, 2023. Boarding at begins 6:00 AM, with MANDATORY security briefing at 6:45 AM
- Where The *Peace* is located in the Ventura Harbor, Dock E (below the grassy area at the end of shops)
- Cost \$169 per diver (available to members only)
- Number of club spots available 7
- What to bring All dive equipment, including weights and tank (equipment may be rented at Dive & Sport)
- What's included in the price Three dives, air fills, lunch, snacks, and non-alcoholic drinks (32% Nitrox is available for a charge of \$10 per fill; passengers may bring their own alcoholic drinks, stored in a cooler)

We received a **nice discount** from *Peace* management, with the normal price for spots on an open boat being \$185. Bookings through a store or another dive club usually range between \$200 to \$225, so you can see our club members are receiving a significant discount for this trip.

Club members attending our April 19 meeting will have the first opportunity to sign up for the dive trip on the *Peace*. (A waiting list will be available in case all spots are filled at our meeting.)

Checks made payable to "Channel Islands Divers," and the club's completed Dive Trip Liability Release are due no later than Saturday, June 10, 2024.

Refunds for cancellations are available until June 17. After June 17, refunds will not be issued by either the club or *Peace* dive boat, unless we are able to fill the vacancy from the club's waiting list.

UPDATE: OTHER CID EVENTS



April 29 - Ojai Raptor Center Tour and Lunch: Members only. All 10 spots full.



May 20 - Harmon Canyon Hike and Lunch: Free. Open to non-members. Currently, 18 members and guests have signed up for the hike. Harmon Canyon re-opened on April 7.



June 18 - Anacapa Seagull Rookery Trip on Island Packers:

Members only price = \$59. Club member discount spots remaining: 3 (We may be able to book additional member spots, if needed.) Non-members may book directly with Island Packers at the regular price of \$63.

Members may also use gift certificates from club raffles by booking directly with Island Packers. The boat is filling quickly, so if you are booking directly with Island Packers, don't wait too long to make your reservations.



September 9 - Refugio BBQ and Beach Dive: Free; open to non-members for a \$5 CID fee. State Park entry fee \$10. Many members tried to get campground reservations, and after researching with the State Parks' Office, members were told the public tends to book extra days on their reservation so they can beat the 6 months' opening-of-reservations restriction. The State representative said cancellations often occur, so CID members should check back frequently for open campground spots. Reservations website: **reservecalifornia.com**
