# Welcome May Speaker AUBRIE FOWLER on California's Marine Protected Areas

Join us May 15th to meet Aubrie Fowler, South Coast Specialist on Marine Protected Areas. Aubrie calls Southern California home.

She spends nearly every day exploring nature, especially during her ocean adventures like diving and sea cave kayaking. Aubrie is a recent divemaster (trained in Indonesia in some of the world's strongest currents!) One of her favorite places to explore above and below water is in marine protected areas (MPA's) and her current position as South Coast Specialist at the MPA Collaborative Network allows her to connect with communities who rely on these special places.

She travels to the Channel Islands on weekends to lead guided kayak and snorkel tours with Channel Islands Adventure Company as well!

She has worked with various nonprofit organizations, including Surfrider Foundation, leading and coordinating members and volunteers. She worked as a California Sea Grant Fellow (2017-18) as the Resource Protection Specialist at the NOAA Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary where she led programs to reduce the threat of ship




ship strikes to whales and collaborated with lobster fishermen to remove lost gear and other marine debris from the Channel Islands. She is an advocate for engaging youth, and worked as a Naturalist at Jean-Michel Cousteau's Ambassadors of the Environment Program.

She holds a Bachelor and Master of Science degrees from California Polytechnic State University where she majored in Biological Sciences with an emphasis on Marine Biology and Fisheries.

### **NEW CLUB EVENT: WHALE WATCHING WITH ISLAND PACKERS**

Sunday, June 23, 2024 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM (6 hours)

**Price for club members: \$75** 

Did you know gray whales were once common throughout the Northern Hemisphere, but they are now only regularly found in the North Pacific Ocean, off the coasts of the United States, Canada, Mexico, and eastern Asia? These large mammals can grow to approximately 49 feet long, weigh about 90,000 pounds, and they make a 12,000 mile roundtrip migration through our backyard (the Santa Barbara Channel) twice a year.

Island Packers reported an exceptional Winter migration of the gray whales. Along with the gray whales, passengers also saw numerous humpback whales, thousands-upon-thousands of common and bottlenose dolphins, and even a basking shark! Now that we are entering the gray whale's and BLUE WHALE'S northern migration season back to the Arctic, the club has booked a non-landing whale watching trip, which will be led by our own Bill Weinerth and Steve Peterson as Park Service Naturalists. Here are the specifics of the trip:

- \* Price: \$75 for club members. (Non-member must book directly with Island Packers at the regular price of \$79.)
- \* Club spots available: 10
- \* Departure: Island Packers, Ventura Harbor, 1691 Spinnaker Drive, #105B, Ventura, CA 93001
- \* Time: 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM (The Summer trips are longer than the Winter trips because Island Packers travels a greater distance to take advantage of the daylight hours and increase the chance for spectacular sightings.)
- \* Food: Lunch can be ordered online at islandpackers.com, or we are also allowed to bring lunch with us. Snacks are available for purchase onboard. Bring cash! The credit card scanner doesn't always work.




# Meet one of our newest Channels Islands Divers club members, Danny Graham
