OCTOBER'S SPEAKER BIO Steve Peterson Baja Diving and Diving Tips

Steve became certified at the age of 14 in 1965 through the Glendale YMCA and has been diving steadily ever since. Glendale YMCA owned Camp Fox on Catalina Island where Steve worked during his high school summers and learned lots of neat ocean stuff. Steve's diving led him into life guarding, and the combination of those developed into the career as a firefighter for Ventura City. He is now retired from the fire department, and spends his time collecting rents from his rentals, harvesting lobster, bike riding, and traveling. A few years ago, Steve went through training and became a volunteer naturalist for the Channel Islands National Park. Through them, he enjoys leading Island hikes.

Over the years, Steve has tried various ways to earn money from diving. Unfortunately, he found it hard to make a living while playing in the water. His diving related jobs have included: teaching, urchin diving, underwater construction, light salvage and recovery work, fish collection, biological studies contract work, deckhand, and chartering dive boats. While those jobs were lots of fun and some paid well, none were very steady. He finally gave up and decided that his diving would just be a fun hobby and his boat just a personal expense.

While attending Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo. Steve received his NAUI Instructor's certification and taught for the college dive club. After graduation, he worked in the Bahamas for Underwater Explorers Society (UNEXSO) as a dive instructor/tour guide. It was a fantastic year, but Steve discovered there was a limited future career in scuba instruction, even at great resort. After a year in the Bahamas, Steve had many job offers from other resorts. However, no one wanted to pay him much.....not nearly what he thought he was worth. So, Steve returned to California and became a fireman. At the fire department, he worked with some extremely smart people who gave him great advice on buying residential rental property. Thankfully, Steve listened to them enough to make his life comfortable now.


Steve claims to have been kayaking diving for 40 years, with his specialty being lobster harvesting the local reefs between Ventura and Santa Barbara. He enjoys kayak diving along our local coast even more than he enjoys boat diving the islands. I highly recommend reading *FATAL DEPTH* of which we have 2 copies in our club library. This book tells the story of diving the *Andrea Doria* by the East coast wreck divers. The *Doria* lies in 250 ft of water 45 miles south of Nantucket Island. I found this book to be highly educational, most interesting, and well written. *Fatal Depth* also ties in well with a few other of our library books (*Shadow Divers, Final Dive, Caverns Measureless to Man*). The 2024 Photo and Video Contest is open to all <u>current</u> CID members. Membership must be in good standing at the time you submit your entries and receive a reward. Since the Photo Contest was not held last year, members may submit photos from the calendar years of 2023 and 2024. Entries will be evaluated by an independent, non-club member judge appointed by the CID Board. The entries will be anonymous to the judge.

Photos and videos will be evaluated on the following criteria:

THEME - How well the photo/video relates to scuba diving
TECHNICAL MERIT - Quality of composition, lighting, contrast, focus, etc.
ARTISTIC MERIT - Visual interest, emotional connection, etc.

Prizes for First and Second place will be awarded for each category. Each member may submit only <u>TWO</u> entries per category. However, each member will be limited to one prize per category. In the event the judge selects two entries by the same person as the winner for a category, a runner-up will be chosen by the judge for the second place prize.

Contest Categories:

Underwater Wide Angel Photo

Underwater Macro Photo

Topside Photo - The subject of the photo must be related to diving.

Underwater Video – The total length of each submission must not exceed 60 seconds and must be a single, unedited clip. No special effects or titles may be added.

Novice - If you have not previously won in our photo contest, you may enter two photos in this category, as well as the other categories.

ENTRY FORMAT: Photos in a JPEG Format and Videos in MP4 Format.

DEADLINE: All photo and video entries along with an entry form and release must be submitted to CID's president, Delbert Stewart, by the club's General Meeting on October 16, 2024.




